Bangladesh

In accordance with the World Trade Organization's Trade Facilitation Agreement, the National Board of Revenue, Bangladesh (NBR) will implement Pre-Arrival Processing (PAP) from July 01, 2019.

Therefore, to comply with the ruling, all carriers must submit Import Manifests 24 hours prior to vessel departure from last port of call **effective July 1, 2019**.

In order to achieve this, shippers are required to submit Shipping Instructions (SI) 72 working hours (equivalents to 3 working days) prior to the vessel's estimated time of arrival (ETA) at all Malaysian ports. Failure to provide the information listed in Section A below will result in denial of permission to load cargo by carrier.

Note: Shippers will be liable for any fines and/or all cost incurred in relations to the noncompliance of the new regulation.

A. Shipping Instructions must include the following details for filing submission:

- 1. Shipper's complete name, address and telephone number
- 2. Consignee's complete name, address and telephone number
- 3. Notify Party's complete name, address and telephone number (mandatory for "To Order" B/L)

4. Consignee Business Identification number (BIN)

- 5. Details cargo description
- 6. Type of packages
- 7. Number of packages (based on smallest packing unit)
- 9. Shipping mark for packaged goods (not necessary for containerized goods)
- 10. Container number
- 11. Seal number
- 12. Gross weight (in kilograms)
- 13. UN code for dangerous goods
- 14. Port of loading / port of discharge
- 15. Vessel and voyage number for intended loading of cargo
- 16. Transport charges method of payment code (e.g. payment in cash, payment by credit card, payment by check, electronic credit transfer, account holder with carrier, not pre-paid)
